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DERMATOLOGIST SPOTLIGHT: Dr. Arijit Coondoo

Our Editorial Team had a hearty conversation with Dr. Arijit Coondoo, Emeritus Professor, Department of Dermatology, KPC Medical College & Hospital to get insights on his long journey in academics and leadership roles in IADVL WB.

1. **Sir, it is an honour to have you on our page. Can you tell us about your journey in dermatology and how you became involved in leadership roles in IADVL WB?**

- **The early years:** Thank you for giving me this opportunity to express my views and interact with my colleagues. My journey in dermatology started exactly half a century back when I enrolled as a student of DDV (as DVD or DDVL was then known) at Calcutta University. I came in contact with an amazing group of erudite teachers who were all very passionate about our fledgling association. It was they who inculcated in me a love for the association even when I was a PGT and encouraged me to join it way back in 1975. Foremost among them was my mentor Prof. Ranjit Kumar Panja and it was under his tutelage that I became a member of the Executive Committee of IADVL WB, when he was the President in 1984. Interestingly 1983-84 was a year of doldrums for IADVL WB. The activities had come to a stop and financially the branch was in the red. It was under these circumstances that I was approached by a couple of my seniors with the request to become the branch secretary. At that young age of 35, I was totally bewildered by this offer and sought the advice of my mentor. He immediately shot down the proposal "First build up your career as a practitioner and academician and then think about any administrative post in IADVL."
- **Entering the fray:** Five years later when I joined CNMC as Assistant Professor and had built up a decent practice, Prof. R K Panja advised me to get involved in IADVL matters. Hence, in 1989, I became the Assistant Editor of IJD. Since then, I have held various posts in the Association (at the state and national level) and in its journals. At the state level I have been Joint secretary (1993), Vice President (2000 and 2004) and President (2005) as well as Chairperson and member of various committees. At the National Level, I have served as Treasurer (2006-8 and Chairperson of a number of committees - Central Finance Committee (2008-2010), IADVL Academy (2010-11), SOP Committee (2012-14), IADVL Constitution Committee (20014-16 and 2018-19), ITATSA (2022-23) and IADVL Awards Review Committee (2023-2024). I have also represented IADVL in the ILDS delegates session in Seoul during WCD 2011. All these years it has been my love for discipline, for the Association and for its members which has been my beacon for work. In the process, apart for the satisfaction of working selflessly, I have gained the love and affection of my seniors, my contemporaries and my juniors. And of course I have developed a close friendship with many dermatologists in various states and cities across the country and beyond – friends with whom I continuously exchange ideas, knowledge as well as patients.
- **An appeal:** At this stage I have to emphasize one point. In an Association of more than 17000 members, we hardly have a couple of hundred odd members interested in working for IADVL. The result is that even at this senile age when I should have retired from Association activities a few years back, I am still serving as a member of various national and state committees. I would take this opportunity to appeal to younger members to come forth and take over the baton from us. In the words of Lord Tennyson let us "Ring out the old, ring in the new."

2. Sir, you have multiple distinguished honours and awards to your credit, what accomplishments are you most proud of?

- **My students:** I have been a teacher for the past 44 years and for me, the greatest accomplishment has been to nurture students who have themselves moved on in life to become some of the most distinguished luminaries of dermatology. Nothing is more satisfying for a teacher than to bask in the glory of his pupils' accomplishments.
- **TSDF:** As a clinician I, along with my student and colleague, Dr. Koushik Lahiri, started a crusade in 2006 against Topical steroid abuse. We described an entity which we christened as "Topical steroid damaged/dependent face"(TSDF). We later published this as a concept article. (Lahiri K, Coondoo A. Topical Steroid Damaged/Dependent Face: An entity of Cutaneous Pharmacodependence. Indian J Dermatol 2016; 61930;265-272).
- **Orations:** My campaign against Topical steroid abuse has continued unabated for almost two decades now and has been the subject of two orations – the IADVL Oration at DERMACON 2015 and the RK Panja oration at DERMAZONE/CUTICON WB 2015. The intense campaign has, at the least raised the level of awareness about the menace among doctors and patients by quite a few notches and that has been a major accomplishment for both my fellow crusaders and me. It would also not be out of place here to mention about another oration delivered by me under the aegis of IADVL WB in 2011 -the AK Datta oration on Vitiligo.
- **Awards:** I have been fortunate enough to receive two IADVL Lifetime Achievement Awards – from the National IADVL in 2017 and from IADVL WB in 2022. Along with this I have also received the Ratan Singh award in 2013 and IADVL President's appreciation awards (2007, 2011 and 2014).

3. The world of dermatology is evolving continuously. How do you stay abreast with the advances and changes in dermatology?

- I passed my MD 45 years back. Since then new diseases have been discovered (even HIV came after that), new medicines have been introduced and new procedures including Dermatosurgery, Lasers and other aesthetic procedures have been introduced. Perforce, I had to stay abreast to keep floating in this vast ocean of dermatology.
- My principal means of doing so is my interaction with my students. Fortunately I have been a teacher since 1980 and this has given me a vast opportunity to learn from my students while teaching them.
- I have been learning profusely from my colleagues too - as a member of various academic groups such as RxDerm and Acad_IADVL. From 1998-2010 I was a member of a group known as GSKAFFORD which comprised of all the who's who of the dermatology academia of the country. Recently I have been learning from two whatsapp groups - Interventional dermatology and Acad Indian dermatology
- Apart from these there are the CMEs and Conferences as well as the various offline journals and textbooks and the online educational aids such as emedicine and DermnetNZ.

4. Having a work-life balance is quite crucial these days. What are your hobbies and interests beyond dermatology.

- **Music:** I have always been a music addict - Rabindrasangeet, Hindi songs of the 60s and 70s and also some old time western music being my favourites.

- **Sports:** As a sports enthusiast (mainly football and cricket) I have always been attracted by the radio commentaries (in the earlier days) and the telecasts during the past 40 years.
- **Others:** Reading books, mainly fictional paperbacks has been a hobby since childhood. But since the advent of mobile online games my leisure time is majorly occupied by online games such as Scrabble, Sudoku and recently the New York Times Wordle. Incidentally some of us dermatologists across the country with interest in wordle have started a whatsapp group named "Derma Wordle World" and through this column I would like to invite any dermatologist who is a wordle enthusiast to join this group.

5. You have taught young minds for a long time now, what advice would you give to our budding dermatologists regarding rational practice and ethical conduct within the medical fraternity?

- As a young dermatologist about to start my medical practice I was given a sage advice by a very senior dermatologist, "Don't run after practice; let practice run after you". Much later, after my practice flourished did I comprehend the real meaning of these words. Basically it was the concept of Karma. Your job is to do your work sincerely following the ABC (Availability, Behaviour and Competence) rule. By following these only will you be able to satisfy your patients. One satisfied patient will bring in ten more and that is the only way your practice will grow; not through touts, commissions or advertisements in the social media. However, the converse is that dissatisfied patients can pull down your practice in a jiffy.
- Also, please refrain from criticizing any of your colleague's prescriptions in front of patients or publicly. Not only is that ethically incorrect but it will boomerang on your face. Finally, practice has its ups and downs. Don't get overwhelmed or downcast by either - deal with both absolutely professionally. Remember that the law of averages will ensure that you will have a steady practice provided you follow the ABC rules.

DERMIBUZZ : PDRN Skin Boosters

“Skin booster” is a term widely used to describe products that are injected into the dermis to improve the extracellular matrix and consequently the quality of skin. Traditionally hyaluronic acid has been the major ingredient of these skin boosters, however scientific innovations in medical aesthetics have discovered many new ingredients to enhance the quality of skin. One of these are the PDRN skin boosters.

As the name suggests, PDRN refers to poly-deoxyribonucleotide. It consists of DNA fragments derived from the sperm cells of *Oncorhynchus mykiss* (salmon trout) or *Oncorhynchus keta* (chum salmon). The chemical structure of PDRN consists of low molecular weight DNA ranging from 50 to 1 500 kDa. It is composed of a linear polymer of deoxyribonucleotides with phosphodiester linkages in which the monomer units are represented by purine and pyrimidine nucleotides.



Skin aging is a complex process that involves both extrinsic and intrinsic aging. Intrinsic aging is due to reactive oxygen species (ROS) which reduces the ability of extracellular matrix to produce collagen and elastin, decreases expression of matrix metallo-proteinases and reduces dermal fibroblasts. Extrinsic aging is mainly due to UV exposure which causes increased production of ROS and increases DNA damage.

PDRN exerts its effects by two main mechanisms:

- Adenosine A2a Receptor
- Salvage pathway of DNA synthesis

The activation of A2A receptors inhibits the NF- κ B and MAPK signaling pathways, which are activated by ROS. Blocking the NF- κ B pathway inhibits the release of several pro-inflammatory cytokines and stimulates the release of anti-inflammatory cytokines. The nucleotides derived from PDRN provide purines and pyrimidine rings for the “salvage pathways.” Salvage pathways help recover bases and nucleosides generated from DNA and RNA degradation, convert them back to nucleotides, and finally reincorporate them into DNA. PDRN contributes to DNA formation by generating nucleotides and nucleosides; this reactivates normal cell proliferation and growth patterns, leading to a faster tissue regeneration and wound healing.

Role of PDRN in skin rejuvenation:

- Increased collagen production
- Anti-inflammatory effect
- PDRN has near-miraculous tissue-repair properties. It can improve the skin repair process by markedly increasing the expression of the vascular endothelial growth factor (VEGF), a master regulator of angiogenesis.
- PDRN Inhibits Tyrosinase activity. Therefore, it inhibits melanogenesis.
- Promotes DNA synthesis.

Commercially available PDRN:

Most commercially available PDRN comes in vials which can contain upto 10ml of viscous transparent liquid which can be loaded on smaller 1ml syringes and then can be injected in the dermis. Some of the companies also add varying concentrations of hyaluronic acid to improve hydration of the skin.

DERMBUZZ : PDRN Skin Boosters

Method of injections:

Upto 3-4 ml of product can be injected on the entire face. The injection depth is intradermal. Tiny micro-boluses are generally injected, spaced out from each other to cover the entire face. Smaller boluses are preferred in areas like under eyes. The boluses diffuse and merge inside the skin within a few hours. about 3-4 sessions 15-30 days apart are recommended for long lasting outcomes.

Side effects:

Bruising, redness and swelling under the eye are commonly observed side effects. No serious side effects have been reported.

Common indications

- Skin rejuvenation, brightness and skin quality enhancement
- Fine lines and wrinkles
- Hyperpigmentation
- Scar correction.
- Wound healing

As of now, PDRN looks promising. It is less expensive than Hyaluronic acid skin boosters and has an excellent tolerability profile. It is a relatively easy to do procedure with minimal downtime. Since it promotes tissue regeneration and biorevitalisation, it is in true sense an anti-aging treatment which should be a part of our armamentarium to defy age and enhance beauty.





RESIDENT'S CORNER: Beat the Heat

Summer is here! While the bright sunny rays may shine down upon us, they can sometimes be brutal to our health. Extreme heat can cause plethora of skin problems like sunburn, heat rash & also aggravate other skin diseases. The hottest season of the year requires extra care of our skin while we enjoy the summer holidays.

SUMMER ISSUES:

There is increased intensity & duration of UV rays, infrared exposure due to trapped geoheat inside home. Along with it, there is also increased transepidermal water loss, increased use of air conditioner(not appropriate humidifier).

As the heat and humidity increases, the sebaceous glands tend to produce excess sebum which lead to stickiness, grease & blocked pores.

For protection of skin from sun damage, there is increased production of melanin(photo-protective properties), resulting in tanning and pigmentation.

SKIN CONCERNS:

- Increased pigmentation, sun tan, melasma, freckles etc.
- Increased photoageing (dehydration, avoidance of moisturisers & sunscreen)
- Miliaria, Sweat dermatitis
- Cholinergic urticaria, Heat contact urticaria
- Acne
- Fungal infections
- Folliculitis
- Photo contact dermatitis
- Polymorphic light eruption(PMLE)

SKIN CARE:

Dos

- ✓ Increased daily intake of water (min 2-3 lts)
- ✓ Use cotton clothings
- ✓ Change clothes immediately after work outs
- ✓ Skin folds should be kept dry
- ✓ Increased intake of fresh fruits, vegetables, coconut water
- ✓ Regular bathing in clean water & use PH balanced soaps
- ✓ Alternate day hair wash with gentle shampoo (Sodium lauryl sulphate, sodium laureth sulphate free)
- ✓ Calamine lotion for miliaria & topical steroid for PMLE can be used

DON'Ts

- ✗ Avoid prolonged exposure of heat & accumulation of sweat
- ✗ Avoid excessive scrubbing
- ✗ Avoid junk foods
- ✗ Avoid heavy makeup
- ✗ Avoid spraying perfumes directly on skin in summer



RESIDENT'S CORNER: Beat the Heat

TYPES OF SKINCARE PRODUCTS TO BE USED IN SUMMER:

1. MOISTURISER-

- ✓ Fragrance free gel based(feels light on skin) for oily skin
- ✓ Lotions for dry skin
- ✓ 1-2 times a day depending on need

2. SUNSCREEN-

- ✓ Gel based, SPF 30 is enough(higher SPFs are thick & heavy on skin)
- ✓ Repeat every 2hrs during outdoor activities
- ✓ Use both indoor & outdoor
- ✓ Last layer of skin care

3. FACE WASH-

- ✓ DRY SKIN: Lactic acid based facewash, Gentle cleanser
- ✓ OILY SKIN: Salicylic acid based facewash
- ✓ Soaps are better to be avoided as they are alkaline & also harsh surfactants like methanol or alcohol, sodium lauryl sulphate should be avoided .

So, there is a need for proper skin care routine as a first line of defence no matter what type skin we have & also hydration & sun protection is the key in summer. Following all these instructions properly, we can greet this summer season with a healthy and bright skin.

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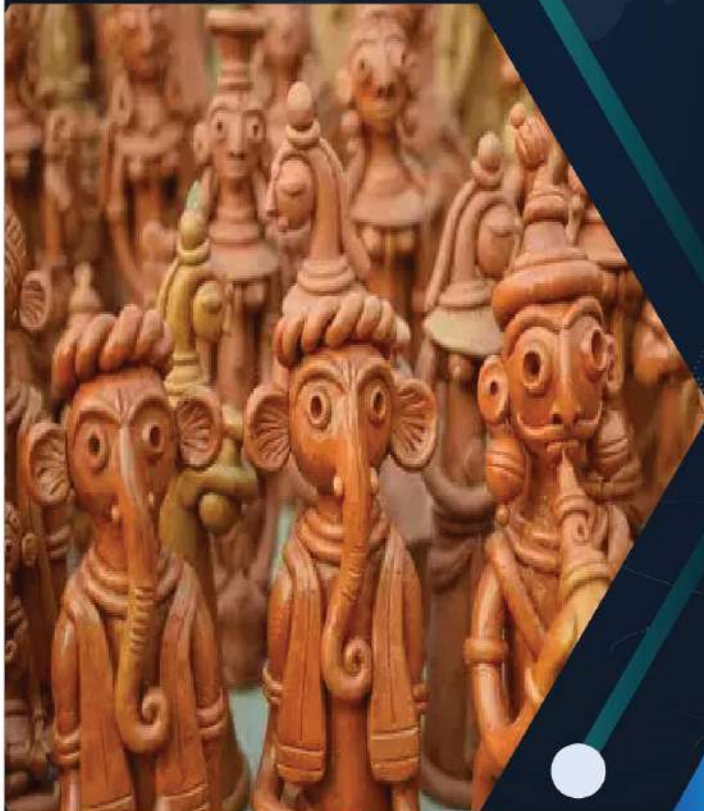
