Professor Salil Kumar Panja is no more.

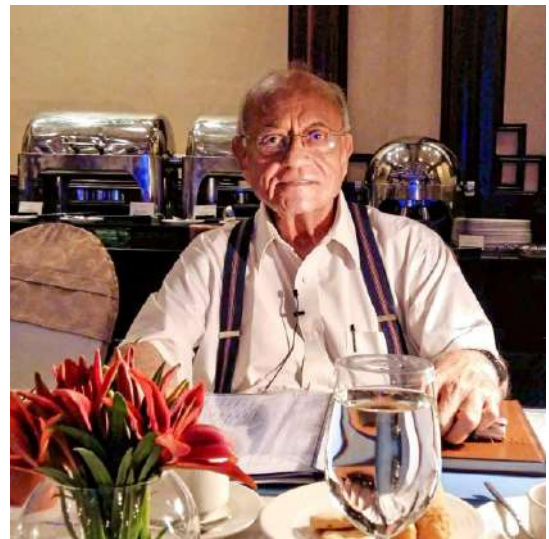
He breathed his last on 30th August at 4.12 pm in a city hospital at the age of 89.

Born on 29 July 1934 he was the Professor and Head of the Departments of Dermatology in SSKM and IPGMER and Calcutta National Medical College.

He was the first Secretary and Past President of IADVL WB and past Editor of Indian Journal of Dermatology.

He was a past National President of IADVL as well. Professor S K Panja or SKP as he was fondly called by his students had innocent and pure soul of a child.

His passion and penchant for academics and clinical dermatology was matchless.

With his demise an era in Indian Dermatology has come to an end.

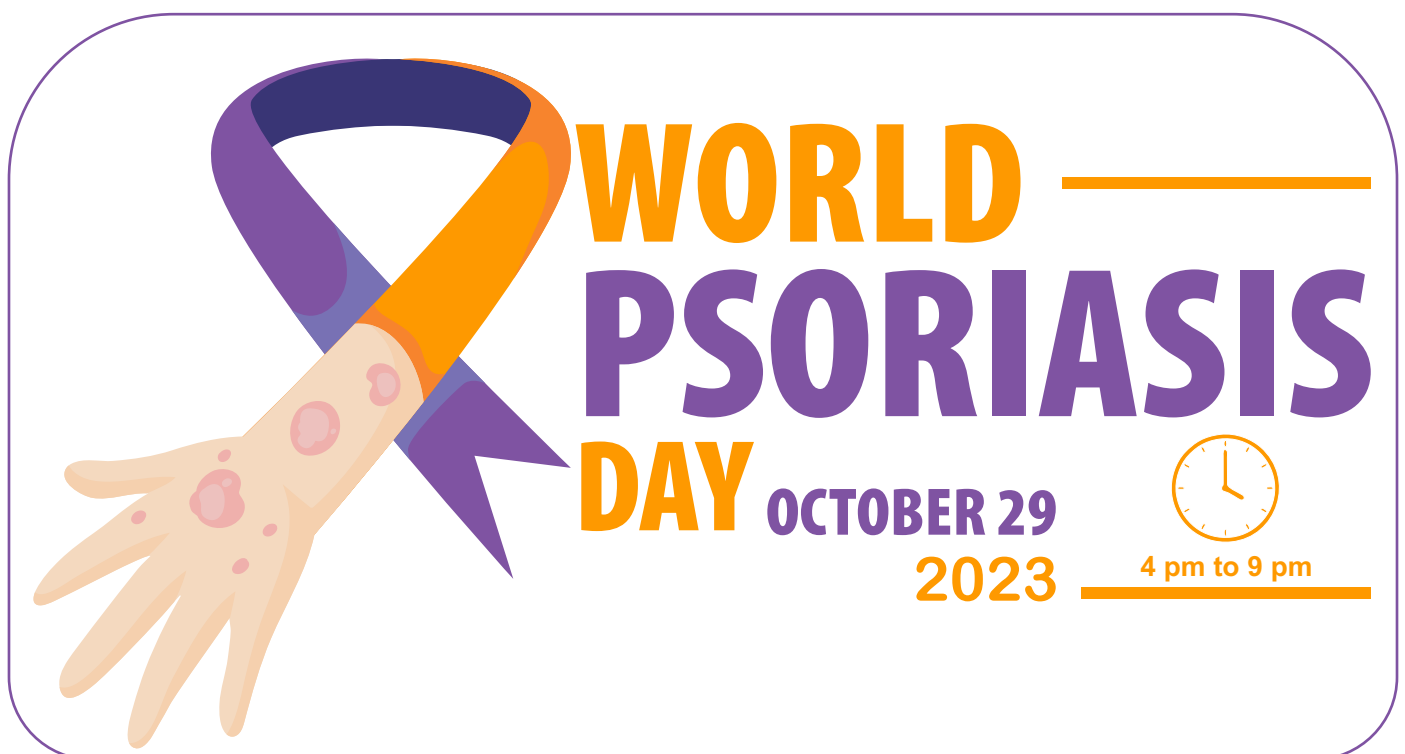

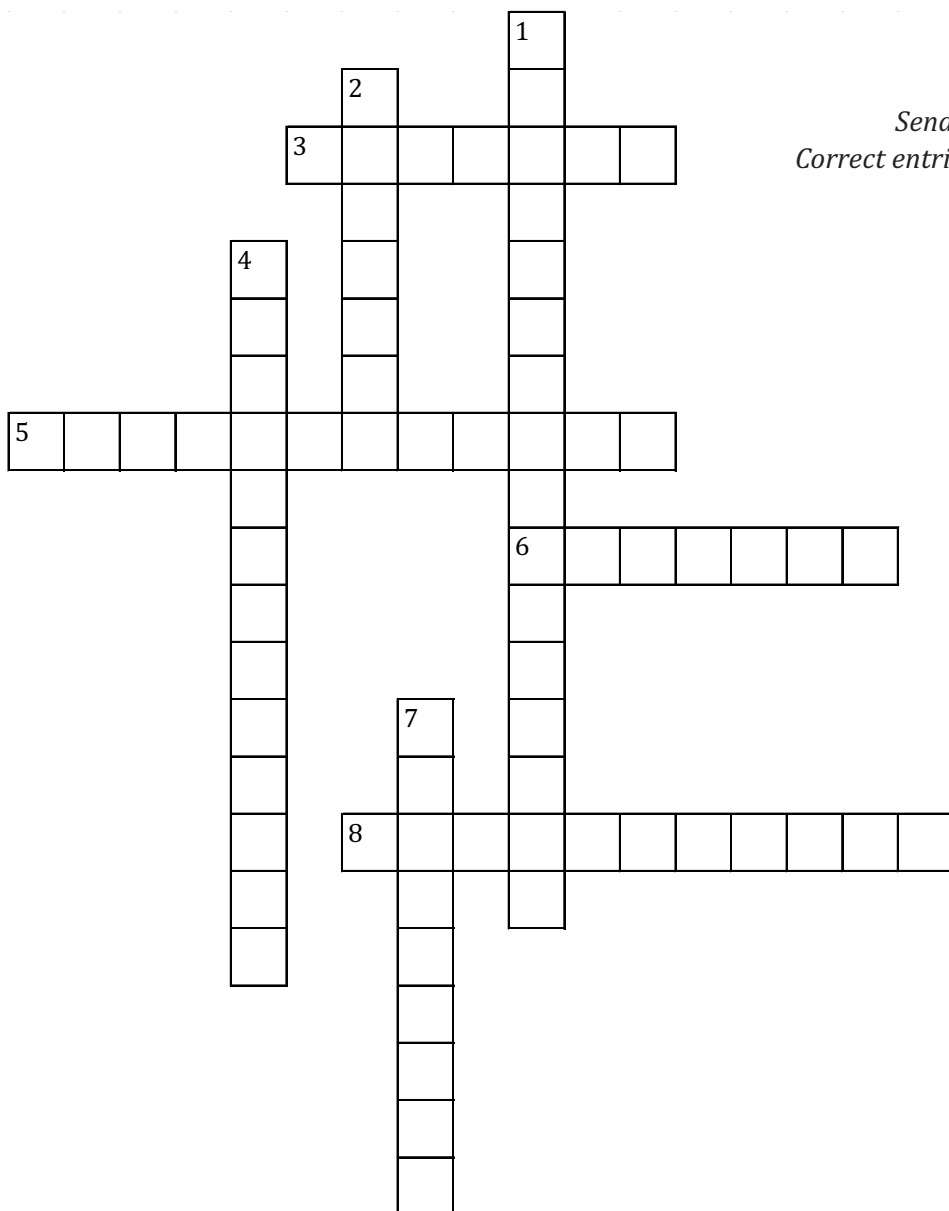
